
# 2018 MUSEUM DAY

# **Marcus Historical Society Field Trip**

July 17, 2018 found a dozen or so members and friends on their way to tour Yesterday's Memories & Vander Haag's Truck Museum in their new facility in Sanborn, Iowa. John and Ruth Vander Haag were waiting with coffee and cookies to give us the grand tour.

Vander Haag's, Inc., which began as a junkyard in the early nineteen thirties, evolved into full service truck dealerships in Spencer, Des Moines, and Council Bluffs, IA, Kansas City, MO, Sioux Falls, SD and Winamac, IN. Along the way John began to collect vehicles that interested him, and the Truck Museum came into being. It includes over 250 fire trucks, semis, pick-ups, touring vehicles, tractors, autos and related memorabilia. His knowledge of their history and the back stories of their acquisition made the tour interesting for everyone.

Ruth, nee Garvin, guided us through Yesterday's Memories, an astounding group of lit showcases and rooms housing thousands of toys, household items, political campaign buttons, posters, etc., clothing, and furniture, all of which is labeled. Of special interest were the displays that featured wedding dresses, baptismal gowns and quilts used by the Garvin family.

It sounds trite to say there is something to interest everyone, but there truly is something to catch everyone's eye.
