Visit the Marcus Historical Building and browse the extensive obituary collection, the family histories and the books prepared for the Marcus Centennial, the Quasquicentennial and the more recent Sesquicentennial to find answers to your questions.

The obituary collection was begun by Arlene Hollenbek and maintained through the efforts of Bonnie Husman, Amber Rassel, Linda Wheeler and Ila O'Brien. Most appeared in area newspapers or on funeral bulletins. To date there are more than a thousand, with more added each year. There is an index. Anyone with an interest in genealogy, history of Marcus, or who just likes to read obituaries and history is invited to come in and browse.

The Marcus Historical Society is looking for volunteers to assist in its operations. In the last year the Historical Society lost three faithful members. Two were officers, Julie Sand, President and Faith Specht, Treasurer. Jack Shea was a dedicated member of the maintenance crew. Currently about ten members, median age 75, are carrying the responsibility of the many collections. Anyone with an interest in the history of Marcus' founders, businesses, or its growth is welcome.

Landscape Improvement

New landscaping was installed in May around the Historical Society building. The edging around the grass was plastic and required constant repair. The decision was made to replace it with concrete edging. Student volunteers removed the plastic edging. The rock that was contained in this area was removed so new concrete edging could be installed. Doug Dreckman used his tractor and loader to remove the rock and saved the members a lot of manual labor. He then did dirt work to reshape the area. The new edging was poured by Down 2 Earth from Sioux Center. The Historical Society project required 250 feet of concrete and the fair board decided to do similar edging around the church and added another 150 feet. Several members worked on this project to complete a job well done! Stop by the building to see what an improvement this change is.
